ACHILLEA MILLEFOLIUM 'Summer pastels' Full sun, dry



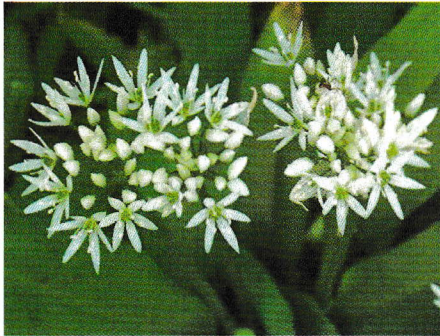
ACONITUM NAPELLUS To 4 ft tall. Sun to part shade. POISONOUS



ADIANTUM Maidenhair fern. Partial to full shade



ALCHEMILLA MOLLIS Not fussy.



ALLIUM URSINUM Wild garlic. Damp rich soil. Sun to part shade.



ANGELICA. 3-4 ft tall. Biennial. Sun to semi shade



AQUILEGIA. Columbine. Tolerates most soils except heavy, poorly drained ones. Light to moderate shade.



ARUM ITALICUM Shade. Flowers in spring, then prominent seeds in the fall. The leaves go dormant in the summer, but are there all winter, except if it is very cold.



ASTER Woods pink. Blooms late summer. A short Michaelmas daisy, 12" - 18" tall



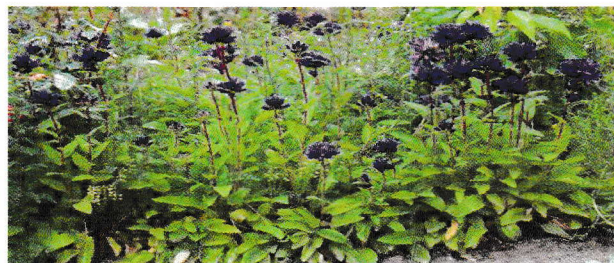
ASTRANTIA MAJOR (Masterwort) Damp, part shade. Do not allow to dry out.



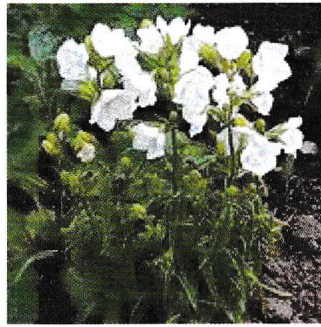
BERGAMOT (*Monarda fistulosa*) Showy flowers and fragrant foliage. The foliage is used to flavour Earl Grey tea. After flowering a new stem may emerge from the centre of the flower and have a new flower on top



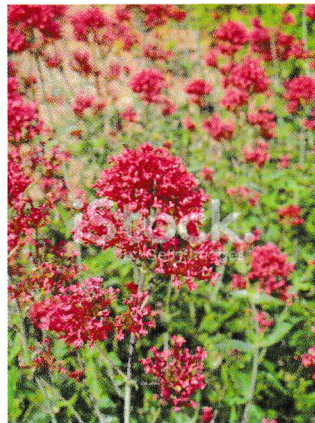
CALYCANTHUS FLORIDUS A substantial suckering bush, 8 – 10 ft tall. Flowers all summer. Flowers are mildly fragrant



CAMPANULA GLOMERATUM (Clustered bell flower) Part shade to sun.



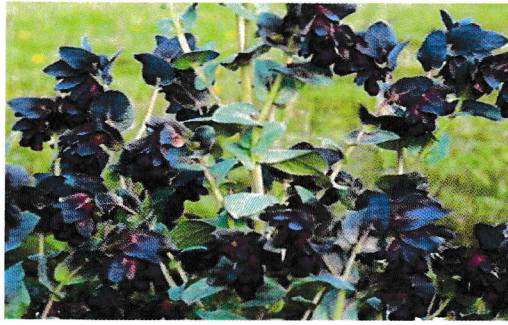
CAMPANULA PERSICIFOLIA (Peach leaved bell flower) Part shade to sun.



CENTRANTHUS RUBER (Jupiter's beard) Tolerates dry sandy conditions. Often found growing at the tops of walls (and sometimes in them) in Britain. If not dead headed they can spread by seed.



CERCIDIPHYLUM JAPONICA (Katsura tree) A medium sized tree, 40 – 60 ft at maturity, known for its fall colour and pleasing shape. It likes humus rich soil, but not soggy. In its native habitat it is an understory tree, so will tolerate partial shade.



CERINTHE MAJOR (Honeywort). Annual. Up to 36" tall in flower beds. Great for pot or hanging baskets. Full sun but keep moist. If allowed to set seed in the flower bed, may self seed and return the following year.



CASCARA BUCKTHORN Native tree, 20 – 40 feet. Moist soil.



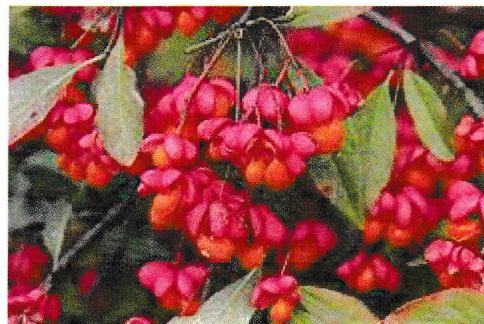
COREOPSIS VERTICILIATA (Threadleaf coreopsis) 15" tall, forms an airy clump. Long bloom period. Full sun to partial shade



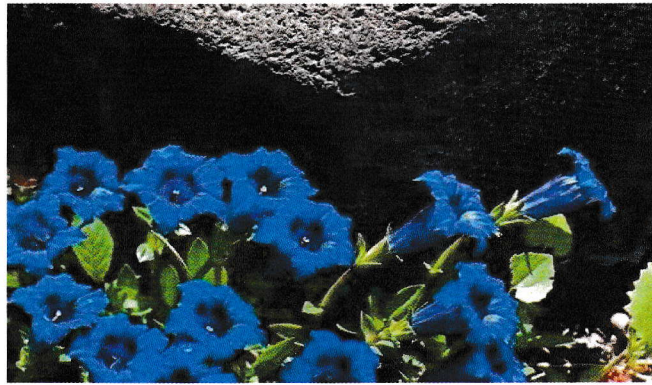
ERANTHIS HYEMALIS (Winter aconite) Charming woodland plant under deciduous trees. Needs sun in early spring. Blooms very early, usually over by the time the early crocuses bloom. Only about 6" high.



ERYNGIUM (Sea holly) Tolerates dry conditions. Stems and bracts and flowers have a blue tinge.



SPINDLE TREE (Euonymus) Fall colour and interesting fruit.



GENTIAN well known for their brilliant blue flowers. They like sun, but not heat, so make sure to keep them moist.



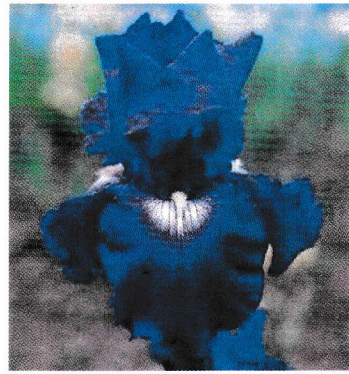
GERANIUM This is not your regular pot geranium (Pelargonium) but a true garden perennial.



GILLENIA TRIFOLIATA (Bowman's root) About 36" tall. Not fussy. The flower stems are red and wiry, and so the flowers flutter in the breeze.

IRIS GERMANICA (Bearded Iris) Full sun. Make sure they are planted in full sun, with the top of their roots showing.



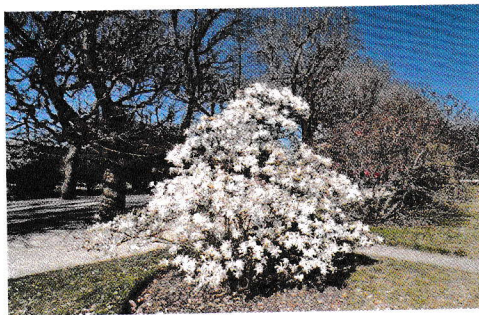
IRIS GERMANICA (Dwarf) These are just like their tall cousins, and need the same conditions, but they are only a foot high. Best grown in groups. Their flowers are about 2/3 the size of the taller varieties.



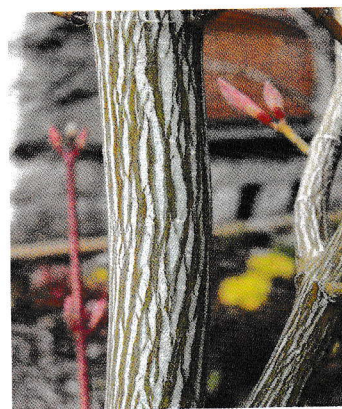
ITEA VIRGINICA (Virginia sweetspire) A rounded deciduous shrub. 3-4" flower spikes late spring. Good fall colour . 3 – 4 feet tall and wide. May sucker to form a substantial clump.



KNIPHOFIA UVARIA (Red hot poker) Likes full sun. May rebloom if dead headed.

PAULOWNIA TOMENTOSA A fast growing tree. Profuse bloomer in April/May. Wood is weak, so shelter from strong winds. May be hard pruned in winter to encourage the formation of huge ornamental leaves (to 24") at the expense of flowers. There is one on the lawn on front of the parliament Buildings in Victoria.



PHLOX PANICULATA The familiar garden phlox. Blooms mid to late summer. Fragrant. Likes moist humusy soil



POLYPODUM GLYCRRHIZA (Licorice fern.) Likes a damp shady location.



PRIMULA. Pale salmon pink double. Is darker than it appears here. Each bloom is like a tiny rose. Strong grower, semi shade.



SAXIFRAGIA X URBIUM (London pride) Very pretty rosettes of evergreen fleshy leaves that give rise to sprays of pale pink flowers in early summer. Likes full to semi shade.



SEDUM 'AUTUMN JOY' Grows 12 – 18 "tall. Pink flower heads late summer to fall. The flower heads gradually turn dark red and persist over the autumn and early winter. Likes full sun, sandy soil.



SPIREA 'ANTHONY WATERER' A small deciduous shrub, 2 – 3 ft tall. Blooms spring to midsummer. New leaves in the spring are reddish purple. Full sun.



STYLOPHORUM DIPHYLUM (Wood poppy) A brilliant yellow woodlander. Happiest in humus rich soil under deciduous trees. Grow 12' – 15' tall.



TRADESCANTIA ANDERSONIANA (Spiderwort) Moist, well drained soil in sun or shade.



VERONICA SPICATA (Spike speedwell) 'Red Fox' Full sun, grows to 18" tall. Good for late summer colour



VIOLA SORORIA 'FRECKLES'

Partial to full shade, although I have successfully grown it in full sun. Larger than a regular violet.
